ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The First Nations Language Instructors' Certificate Program is designed to provide accredited academic training for Language Instructors and Teacher's Aides working in First Nations communities. The revised program consists of ten 3-credit hour university degree courses delivered at the Saskatoon campus. Students should already be fluent in a First Nations language and possess the desire to develop their instructional skills. Upon completion of all ten courses students will be granted a certificate.

The program has been revised with enhanced language instruction and curriculum development content to meet the needs identified by First Nations communities. As well, a new course in community-based curriculum development is now included. As part of the course, the Saskatchewan Indian Cultural Centre will deliver a series of First Nations cultural seminars geared toward supporting student success.
